# 2. IGU International Congress, Cologne, Germany 2012 - report

During the IGU Congress in Cologne, Germany, 26 - 30 August 2012 Commission on Climatology organized 5 Sessions (27-28 August) with 15 timeslots covering the topics:

Climate change and variability in different spatial and temporal scales, chaired by N. Taper
The most fruitful session with 6 timeslots and 24 presentations from all over the world.
The very broad session theme led to the diversity of topics brought up from historical climatology to climate change environmental impacts.

# Weather and Climate Extremes, chaired by Z. Ustrnul

During two timeslots 5 presentations, mostly devoted to precipitation extremes, were given. The participants discussed also the impact on climate extremes on environment and social/economical activities.

# Applied Climatology in 21 Century, chaired by A. Monteiro

4 presentations were given by participants from Germany (meteorological indices versus forest fires), Russia (thermally extreme climate and the growing period variability) and Japan (using satellite images in applied climatology) as well as prof. Monteiro herself (health and climate).

Potential Impacts of Climate Variability and Change on Agriculture, chaired by J. Winkler
During 3 timeslots 11 presentations were given. Climate change and agriculture issue was
discussed by both climatologists and economists. Both temperature (described by e.g.
growing degree days) and precipitation (by drought indices) changes were taken into
account.

# Urban climates, chaired by A. Bitan and H. Saaroni

Different aspects of climate in the cities were presented. From always hot topic of urban heat island to adapting to climate change.

During the sessions 55 presentations were given by scientists from 21 countries, representing Europe, Asia, North and South America, Australia and Oceania. The total number of sessions participants is difficult to estimate.

There was also a joint session CoC-IGU MRP: Climate change in the areas with Mediterranean climate: characteristics, mitigation and adaptation organized/announced but due to the small number of participants interested as well as some personal problems it was finally cancelled.

- ✓ Impacts of climate variability and change on eco-system, agriculture and human society.
- ✓ Precipitation in various regions of the world.
- ✓ Climate-related risk and hazard <Joint session with Hazard and Risk Commission>
